## The International 5.5 Class newsletter

Sailing season is about to start here in the northern hemisphere as it ends down-under. The Class activity has been high with two world championship held in 4 month. With 27 participants, Sydney proved rightly how the 5.5 Class is entitled to its international status.

Nevertheless the great champions like Schümann, Marazzi and Gullichsen were there fighting hard to prove their talents. Older boats (and older skippers...) like *Barranjoey* (Bill Solomons) enhanced the fleet by their presence and showed how the 5.5 is a good investment and keeps you joung & fit!

Once the event was over, some enthusiastic 5.5 Australian sailors promised to show up more often in Europe with new boats and new ideas! Well that was last winter, now lets look at what lies ahead of us for this season.

Obviously the major event this summer will be the European championship end of June in Austria on lake Attersee. Only 4 years ago the 5.5 fleet started growing again in this country and there we are: having a major event to support them, what a success for **Edi Bernd** (Belladonna II)!

All the other fleets will also have their championship starting with Italy in May where 20 boats have already registered!

Two new boats were built last winter at **Wilke**. One is *Maitresse* NED-35







for our president **Hans Nadorp**, this is his 4<sup>th</sup> 5.5! and the other was for **Jürg Menzi** also his 5<sup>th</sup> boat named *Marie-Françoise* XVII, SUI-217.

On the day she was launched, Jürg won the first race of the season on lake Thun...

But let's not forget about all those other sailor buying second hand boat, repairing them and helping maintain the 5.5 fleet with a decent participation and representation world-wide. In Germany, **Jörg Sontag** is about to re-launch *Saphir* a world champion in need of a big restoration program. In Norway, in place called Risor, **Steffen Ousdal** has managed to bring a nice little fleet of Evolutions together triggering a renewed interest for the 5.5 in this country.
