The 2006 sailing season is now well underway and I haven't had much time to inform you about all the latest events but better late than never!

## Alpen Cup: Menzi's regata

Sailed late April in Torbole on lake Garda, the Alpen Cup event was strongly supported by **Jürg Menzi** in need for having fun guaranteed after a long winter season without sailing.

Twelve boats attended the race with a majority from Switzerland. **Menzi** showed his ability to manage his direct opponents and was able to keep **Gullichsen** at large. In third place, **Hans Nadorp** capable of the best also showed lack of consistency with a 7 and 8 th ranking.

This race will be re-sailed next year on the same premises at the same period.

# Swiss Championship: 11 races!

This was maybe "The Championship" to be remembered. The club of Estavayer put a very professional team together to organize the eleven race event! The south-easterly winds blew constantly day after day during the four days event. Shorter courses were setup so the fleet could

increase the numbers of races per day. And again the **Menzi** team mastered the fleet right from the beginning although this time they faced a stronger competition from **Christof Burger** (SUI-207) coming very near to beating him in the last race. "This was hot!" commented **Jürg** after the race. This was his 9<sup>th</sup> Swiss champion title in a row. Despite this success for the Swiss fleet we must not disregard the catastrophic figures of the participation which shrank down to only 18 swiss boats.

# Italian Championship: where are the 'tofosi'?

In the wake of his swiss success Menzi won again in Verbania on lake Maggiore. But is this event still an Italian Championship or merly a Swiss regata outside Switzerland? Out of twelve boats on the starting line only three were italian, all classics, at least there was some consistency there...and *Carabella* from Alfredo Delli takes the prize. The existence of the Italian fleet is at stake and if the spirit of 2003 and 2004 disapear then this fleet might become history again...

#### New boats: fast but not so...

Two boats (Sisterships) were built by **Wilke** during last winter. One for **Marazzi** (SUI-219) and the other for **Pieper** (SUI-210). The stern section has been extended in a way that the deck has a very small angle. **Jean-Claude Vuithier**, project manager for Marazzi pretends he was able to increase the dynamic water length by nearly 20 cm! On the other





hand **Seb Schmidt** had a new keel design for them. With too little training and trimming sessions they never were a threat to the 'older' boats but it is maybe just a question of time.

A third boat is now under completion by **Philippe Kolly** on the shores of lake Geneva she will be followed by a sister-ship for french sailor **Chrisitan Hauvette.**
