The 5.5 comes back to Austria (by Edi Berndt)

Since I brought my Belladonna I (ex Zirkon) to Lake Attersee about 10 years ago the number of 5.5 has tremendously increased.

Seventeen 5.5s are now sailing in Austria, after nearly 3 decades of absence.

10 Classics are present in Austria out of which 8 are well maintained. Four of them are active and sail the yardstik races. Classic *Totila* is currently not sailing.. *Bounty* with the sail number G-12 is under restoration and *Shangrila* was sold three years ago to Italy. She is named now *Cibele*. *Swift Swiss* came from the Netherlands to lake Traunsee. The two classics on lake Wörthersee changed owners. *Goff II* is now owned by Mr. Prommegger and *Artemis II* (e.g. an ex-Pieper Boat) found with Mr.Ingo Hopfgartner an ambitious fan.

The first Evolution brought to Austria was *Kamber* by the brothers Wallentin. She is an australian ship, designed by B. Lexcen and built in Sydney by Hudson boat building. She inspired me for the 5.5 class and so I bought my first *Belladonna*. A Britton Chance Evolution named *Zirkon*. In the last years 4 more Evolutions came to Austria joining the fleet. These are *Aperino*, *Pan*, *Spirit of the Lake* (lake Wolfgangsee) and now Mr. S. Holzinger (lake Traunsee) bought the last one from Switzerland (ex-Sunrise SUI-115).

Christian Scheinecker bought *Pungin* from H.P. Schmid, the first Modern in Austria. He named her *Lupo di Lago* AUT-18, but sold her two years later to Norway. As You know I'm now sailing the 'old' SUI-180 *Belladonna* II(ex Rana, ex la Diala) under the number AUT-16), which is an early modern.

All of this is certainly the result of the 5.5 Events in Austria that so many Evolutions are now sailing in Austria. I'm happy to state an increase of the Austrian fleet in the last 10 years of more the 50 %.

Many thanks to all friends in the world of 5.5m class who came to Austria just for a race. You really did more then you may be thinking for the Class.
